Cohasset Middle School (CMS)




76% of CMS parents said they'd spoken to their child(ren) about underage drinking.




28% of CMS students said they'd discussed underage drinking with their parent(s).


Cohasset High School (CHS)



83% of CHS parents said they'd spoken to their child(ren) about underage drinking.



40% of CHS students said they'd discussed underage drinking with their parent(s).
